

#### From the Pastor

Hello friends,

I write this from the waiting room up at Mayo in Rochester - not for myself, but visiting a priest friend who had a fall this week. Anyhow, pray for Fr. Whatshisname (God is okay with anonymity). After our very well attended Christmas liturgies ran their course, I spent the first few days this past week down in the basement of the rectory. I've spent the last few years building up a woodshop that meets my flavor of recreation needs very effectively, and I'm currently working on an altar for the St. Pat's (Onalaska) side chapel – a big old bear of a 72" x 36" altar. Not to brag, but it's going to be gorgeous. Beginning with my old man's general contractor work in California and making full use of a woodshop at Mundelein Seminary, woodworking has been an important hobby for me. After a day's rich work with you delving into your relationships with the Lord, I find it cathartic to feel the grain of the wood under my fingers, to see stock become lumber and to see lumber become product. If you ever see me with dirty fingernails, you can reliably count on it being a healthy and tenacious mixture of glue and sawdust.

This next week I'll be heading up to Wausau (Rothschild) after Monday's 8:00 (Coon Valley) and 10:30 (Viroqua) Masses for a retreat with some of the other priests of the diocese. As I understand it, this retreat will delve into story work – understanding personal narrative, the baggage and blessings we carry, and the way the Holy Spirit weaves His way in and through this whole process. If you've been to confession or engaged in spiritual counselling of any sort with me, I hope you take it as a comfort to know I place no more demand for spiritual integration on you than I do on myself. The lifelong (and longer) work of growing in sainthood is not something that's confined to regular or occasional Sunday Mass attendance or annual confessions - it's not even confined to sharing your morning coffee with the Lord before the kids wake up or the underrated blessing of daily Mass. While those tangible artifacts structure our spiritual life and provide the skeleton to hold the soul upright, the Christian spiritual life is a matter of wholehearted discipleship, of letting the Holy Spirit into every moment. It's hard work, and it's very good work.

God bless you, and may Jesus Christ's light shine into every corner of your heart as we continue through the Christmas season.


