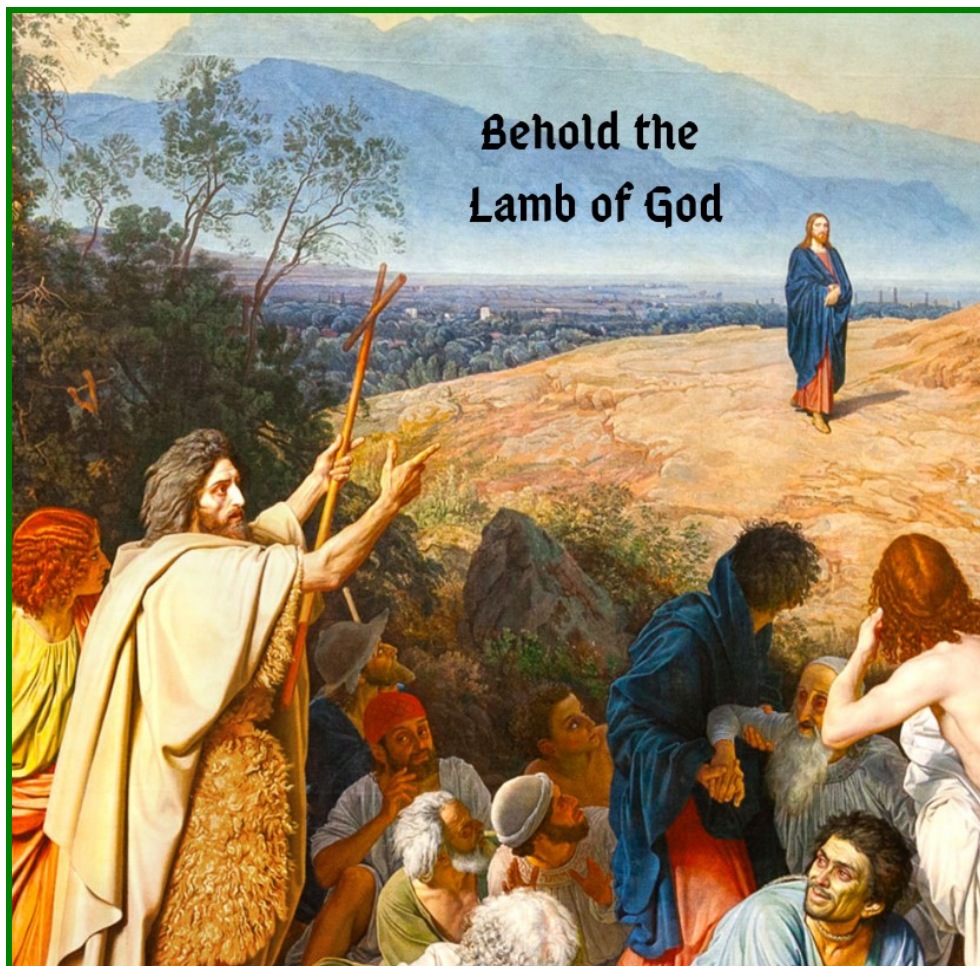

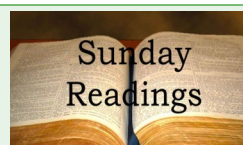

If you are 70 ½ or older, you can do a **qualified charitable distribution (QCD)** of up to \$100,000 a year from your **IRA directly to a charity**. The distribution won't show up in your adjusted gross income and CAN count toward your required minimum distribution (RMD). The QCD allows you to be more strategic with your RMD. Consult your tax advisor before making any decisions. If a QCD is for you, please consider St. Mary's Parish as your charity of choice.

From the Pastor

Hello friends,

My. Goodness. I may write to the Diocese to officially petition them to award Fr. Aro (the pastor out in Cazenovia, Keyesville, and Lone Rock) the “Windiest Commute” award (not “windy” like “wind” – that’s Fr. Bowe and the Ridge parishes – but “windy” like “turny, curvy, ‘don’t drive in the snow’” type “windy”). I made my way down to Lone Rock last Saturday for the first Mass of the weekend, and the faithful regulars greeted me warmly and with open hearts. After supper with Fr. Kuhn and an overnight in Keyesville, I celebrated the Masses in Keyesville and Cazenovia (that stretch of road was the specially “windy” part) before making my way back here Sunday afternoon. A few hundred miles and a new set of axles later, and we’re back on track. Again, thank you for your understanding and good grace as I stepped away for the weekend – it’s one of the more niche responsibilities of a Dean to make himself known in other Deanery parishes, and I am grateful for the chance to visit these folks and get to meet them. I love being here and I love being your pastor, but perhaps there’s something I miss from my associate days (that is, when our parishes could be covered by just myself or my pastor in a pinch) about sporadically covering Masses elsewhere in the roughly Wausau area. There’s a unique feel to a given parish – a blend of history and culture and present fears and excitements and relationships that comes together to give a place some sense of character (“personality” is almost too strong a word).

Anyhow, now back to it for Ordinary Time. Last weekend we prayed through the last moment of the Christmas season – after Advent’s sense of invitation and Christmas’ welcome of the child Jesus into our hearts, we now follow the magi and John and Jesus Himself into the wilderness, entering this season where the movement of extraordinary grace expands and takes root in the ordinariness of our lives. We’ll see what 2026 brings us.

And finally, two notes on brother priests. First, please pray with me a little prayer of gratitude for Monsignor Scheckel for his generosity and presence last weekend. Speaking with one of you, the word we came up with him is “expansive” – I’m grateful to have known him before ordination and then to have him for a neighbor as I started Pastoring, now it is a blessing to have him helping out here. Second, a congratulations to Fr. Dhein (who has had a relationship with both our parishes at different times and for a long time ran much of the business side of things at the Diocese) on being named a “Prelate of Honour to His Holiness Pope Leo” – that is to say, a Monsignor. I don’t quite know what a timeline looks like for things, but I know there will be a celebratory Mass coming up at some point – keep your eyes open.

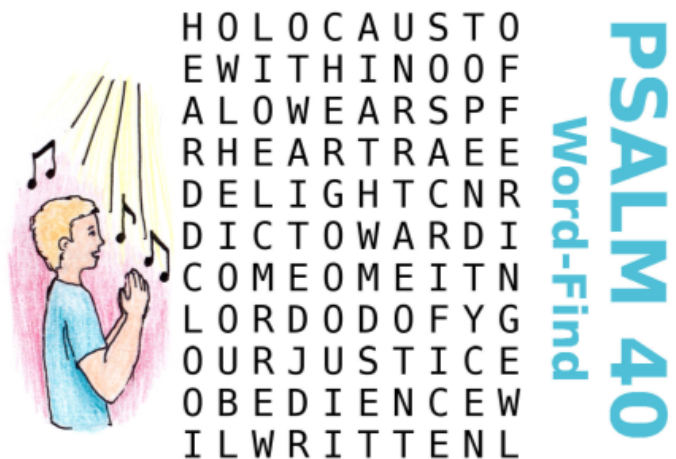
