

If you are 70 ½ or older, you can do a **qualified charitable distribution (QCD)** of up to \$100,000 a year from your **IRA directly to a charity**. The distribution won't show up in your adjusted gross income and CAN count toward your required minimum distribution (RMD). The QCD allows you to be more strategic with your RMD. ## From the Pastor

Hello friends,

This last week we prayed a special Mass on Thursday – every January 22, the calendar anniversary of the Supreme Court’s original decision in *Roe v. Wade* to allow abortion up to the point of viability in a pregnancy, the Church in the United States holds a special day of prayer for the protection of the unborn. I think it’s pretty well established in most folks’ attention that respect for and protection of human life from conception to natural death is critically important to the Catholic Church. This all stems from a Catholic anthropology (the study of the human person) that understands the human person as being made in the image and likeness of God, a union of body and soul that comes together at the moment of conception (not at any point afterward) and lasts all the way until death (when body and soul are separated for a time, but not forever). Much social action has sprung out of the Catholic Church over the last fifty or so years since this initial decision, and our ongoing prayer and work for the preservation, protection, restoration and renewal of human life remains a major part of the Church’s life in the world.

Anyhow, on Thursday we came together to pray this Mass and entrust this work to the Lord. It made me recall back in 2022 when *Roe v. Wade* was overturned and the authority to make decisions about abortion went back to individual states, being struck by an important reality – even while there is some real sense of “victory” or “accomplishment” in the overturning of such a charged decision that so many people have been engaging for so many years, the fact remained that families and women and children in crisis on June 23 would still be in crisis on June 25. The responsibility still stood and is still often taken up by the Lord’s people to care for and accompany these people in their very real needs, for us, as Pope Francis liked to say, to go out to the peripheries.

I think this all highlights the beauty of the Church’s social teaching – when we do things well, we are not pretending that a decision or the presentation of a fact is all it takes to assist and accompany souls. As Pope Benedict elegantly put it in the opening of his powerful letter *Caritas in Veritate* (Charity in Truth), “Love – caritas – is an extraordinary force which leads people to opt for courageous and generous engagement in the field of justice and peace.” Through my years actively serving the Church, I am grateful to have witnessed powerful responses to the Lord awakening His Church to His people’s needs. More work remains to do, a truth that will stand until the end of all time – just as much as ever before, the perennial question for us to ask in any given moment is not “Lord, how will you fix things?” but “Lord, what do you ask of me right now?”
