


Hello friends,

You very well may be reading this during our very short Fourth Week of Advent (Saturday at 4:00 until Sunday at 3:59:59.99), so I'll refrain for the moment from wishing you a Merry Christmas. During these last few hours of Advent, I'll wish you a blessed remainder of this invitational season and share an opportunity that may be relevant to you – Retrouvaille. The Diocese's chancery bulletin (a weekly publication with updates and business from around our home turf) just posted the following:



 Marriage in Distress? No matter how hopeless it seems, forgiveness and trust are possible. Retrouvaille is a Catholic-based program that helps couples through difficult times in their marriages, some even after separation or divorce. It is not

I haven't personally helped with a Retrouvaille weekend, but after first hearing about it back in seminary from one of my trusted moral theology professors I've been sold. Since then, I've received testimony from several couples to highly recommend the program as a powerful tool that helped them (that is to say, saved their relationship) when they were in a particularly difficult place in their marriage. If you have any questions, please feel free to ask – I'll try my best to answer them (or more likely to help you find the answers), of course with confidentiality.

And in case you're reading this after 3:59:59 on Sunday, Merry Christmas! My last few weeks have been filled up with the beautiful grace of hearing numerous confessions around here and up in La Crosse – for me it is one of the greatest graces as we approach this Moment of Christ's light breaking into the world's and our own darkness to accompany people through their own process of owning the "here's where it hurts" and inviting the Lord to do His healing work. Thank you for your own Advent work these last few weeks – now let's tip over into Christmas with renewed joy and hope!


