



DID YOU KNOW?





From the Pastor

Hello friends,

I want to thank all of you who participated in any way in our liturgies over the last few weeks here. From our regular daily and weekend Masses to Christmas to the Feast of the Holy Family, the liturgy has always seemed to me the heart and most important part of what we do and who we are. This certainly doesn't mean the rest of our lives and ministries and parish cultures are unimportant – just that everything we do is given life first and foremost by our encounter with Jesus Christ in His Word and His Body.

Now let me share an important disclaimer before diving into a rabbit hole: this is not a commentary on how great or horrible any parish anywhere is – it's just an observation that maybe says something about our sister parishes and the state of the Church today. As I gathered with my fraternity for a few days after last weekend's Masses and as we hashed out our experience with Christmas in our respective parishes, one big thing struck me: our Christmas Mass attendance was not all that much higher than our regular weekend attendance (perhaps a ten to fifteen percent rise but not a particularly massive increase). This has not always been the norm, in fact I might anecdotally say it is a bit novel. More common perhaps is a sharp and noticeable increase in attendance at Christmas and Easter, giving rise to an unhappily pejorative criticism of "Chreasters" – members of the faithful attending only for these two moments but not during the rest of the year. This narrative didn't line up with my experience this year.

So why do I bring all this up? Again, firstly to highlight my gratitude for your participation at our highest moments, but also your regular participation in our regular life. Secondly, to note that I don't know if this phenomenon is actually limited to our parishes. As we go about our Big Picture work with the Rebuild My Church initiative one of our studies involves trends in Mass attendance since 2005. From 2005 to 2019 we saw a decline of roughly 45% in the numbers of people across the Diocese attending Mass on the weekend. COVID obviously marked an outlying Moment in this trend, but since then we've been witnessing positive growth (slow, but steady) across the board. I personally think we're seeing the results of A) the Holy Spirit's movement and B) the Lord's People responding in hopeful desire to His initiative. Anyhow, again I just want to thank you for responding to the Lord – for inviting His light into your life and your families, for engaging Christmas with open hearts and minds, and for living our shared discipleship alongside each other and myself.

The Blessing of the Home

How to Chalk Your Doors for Epiphany Sunday

The Church has a custom of blessing homes on the Feast of the Epiphany and the week following. Family and friends gather to ask God's blessing on their homes and those who live in or visit the home. It is an invitation for Jesus to be a daily guest in our home, our comings and goings, our conversations, our work and play, and our joys and sorrows.

A traditional way of doing this is to use chalk blessed during the Epiphany liturgy and write above the home's entryway: 20 + C + M + B + 26. The letters C, M, and B have two meanings. They are the initials of the traditional names of the three Magi: Caspar, Melchior, and Balthazar. They also abbreviate the Latin words *Christus mansionem benedicat*: "May Christ bless this house." The "+" signs represent the cross, and 2026 is the year.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR BLESSING THE HOME

Using the blessed chalk, mark the lintel of your front door (or front porch step) as follows:

20 + C + M + B + 26

while saying:

The three Wise Men, Caspar, Melchior, and Balthazar followed the star of God's Son who became human two thousand twenty-five years ago. May Christ bless our home and remain with us throughout the new year. Amen.

Then offer the following prayer:

Visit, O blessed Lord, this home with the gladness of Your presence. Bless all who live or visit here with the gift of Your love; and grant that we may manifest Your love to each other and to all whose lives we touch. May we grow in grace and in the knowledge and love of You; guide, comfort, and strengthen us in peace, O Jesus Christ, now and forever. Amen.

At times, God has commanded His people to mark their doors. The Israelites marked their doors with the lamb's blood on the night of the Passover. A similar command was given with the Shema Yisrael:

"Hear, O Israel: The Lord is our God, the Lord alone. You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your might. Keep these words that I am commanding you today in your heart...and write them on the doorposts of your house and on your gates" (Deuteronomy 6: 4-6, 9).

"Chalking the door" is a way to celebrate and literally mark the occasion of the Epiphany and God's blessing of our lives and home. With time the chalk will fade. As it does, we let the meaning of the symbols written sink into the depths of our heart and be manifest in our words and actions.

A heart-felt thank you is extended to Father Joe and the parishioners at St. Mary's, Coon Valley, for the Christmas wishes and gift. We also thank all of you for singing so beautifully during the Christmas season. It is truly an honor to serve this parish with our musical talents, given to us from our heavenly Father. We wish you all a very Happy, Healthy New Year.
