

FOCUS: The Lord has done great things for us.

Today's readings invite us to reflect on our gratitude for what God has done for us, particularly through Christ. It begins with acknowledging that it is the Lord who has acted on our behalf. Such recognition can in turn lead us to a greater appreciation for God's greatness, to a deeper faith, and to true worship.

LITURGY OF THE WORD

In the first reading, Naaman is healed after following Elisha's instructions to plunge himself into the Jordan seven times. Afterward, he pledges to offer sacrifice only to the Lord. Paul writes to Timothy that it is the Gospel of Jesus Christ for which he is suffering, even to the point of chains, like a criminal. In the Gospel, Jesus is traveling throughout Samaria and Galilee when ten lepers call to him, Jesus, Master! Have pity on us! Jesus tells them to go show themselves to the priests and the lepers are healed while on their way. Only one leper, a Samaritan, returns to give thanks to Jesus.

DID YOU KNOW?



My classmate Fr. Levi was sitting next to me on the car ride up here yesterday, and when I asked him "do you want to add anything into my bulletin article for next weekend?" He said, "I got this." What follows is his doing.

Dear people of God,

I, Fr. Levi Schmitt, write this article as I traverse the northern corridor of Western Wisconsin, otherwise known as Highway 53, with your pastor/parochial administrator. Seeing as his digits are occupied with the steering wheel, I have determined to run an interview with him so that you might better answer the question, "who is Fr. Joe Richards really?"

Fr. Levi's Question 1: Tell me something about yourself that people wouldn't expect.

Fr. Joe's Answer: I was originally meant to be the only one ordained in my class, until my classmates got held back (editor's comment: this is a dig at me).

Question 2: What's your favorite memory?

Answer: Walking the Camino (Spain). I'm feeling nostalgic for it; it started my backpacking adventures. There was a simplicity to it; the entire focus of the day was to walk 20 miles. That's it. It was a good time to put life together.

Question 5: What would be the best way for the people of your parishes to support your ministry?

Answer: Pray, that is, to have a really good relationship with Christ themselves. That's it. That's the best thing they could possibly do for me.

Interviewee question to the interviewer: Why did you say "yes" to this trip to the Boundary Waters?

Interviewer answer: Besides getting me out of a week of school (I'm a school chaplain), I just needed something "gritty" in my life. Everything is always just so clean—plus I'm bored of emails.

Question 6: Who, besides Christ, would you like to model your life on, and why?

Answer: There are three priests that come to mind. They will remain anonymous. One, because he's from our diocese. Another, because he's famous. And the last, because you wouldn't recognize him.

Question 7: How do you prepare your homilies?

Answer: I take a look at the readings on Monday or Tuesday. Sit with them throughout the week. On Friday or Saturday I'll spend an hour or two praying with them. After that I'll record 5-10 versions on my phone until I find the "flow" I like.

Question 8: What do you do if you are attacked by a group of clowns?

Answer: Go for the nose.
