

From the Pastor

Hello friends.

We're starting up Religious Education this weekend, which opens the door for me to share the "why" behind our family-based model rather than a classroom model – bear with me, because I've got a few hard words to drop. Let's start with a preamble: I love you and I love being your priest. Alright, let's dive in.

We've had a few baptisms lately in Viroqua. Maybe you've heard me share my love for baptisms during Mass – yes, it's a good way of drawing the whole parish into a family's celebration, but more than that it's a good way of communicating the way the entire Christian community prays and works for each and every brother and sister. That's a reminder we need sometimes – being Christian is not a solo effort. If I ever think my relationship with Christ is for me alone, I'm in real trouble. My relationship with Christ, along with any healing, reconciling, sanctifying work I do is always about drawing me deeper into something bigger (Christ's body) and supporting the other members of His Church. Keep up the good work there.

Back to baptisms. One of the elements of the baptism rite, whether at Mass or outside of Mass, tells you something about my approach to religious education. Before the baptism part of the baptism rite, Deacon or I ask a set of questions to the kid's parents and godparents: "What name do you give your child?" ("First & Middle Names"). "What do you ask of God's Church for First and Middle Name?" ("Baptism"). Then the celebrant asks a very charged question: "In asking for baptism for your child you are undertaking the responsibility of raising him/her in the faith. Do you understand this responsibility?" Therein, my friends, lie all the marbles. Give me a second to step up onto my soapbox now – sometimes we operate out of the misunderstanding that religious formation is the church's responsibility primarily. In the sense that it is the community of believers who raise up and support a forming Christian, this is very true. In the sense that it is primarily the job of St. Mary's or St. Stan's or St. Michael's Catholic Parish to educate a child, this is not true. From the moment of baptism and that charged "Do you understand this responsibility?" it is primarily the parents' and caregivers' job to form and educate and introduce a soul to Jesus Christ, and one of the roles of the parish is to support them in that work. My persisting hope with this family-based religious education program is that it gives you the tools you require and the encouragement you need when you're entering uncharted waters to walk alongside of and just a bit ahead of your sons and daughters toward Jesus Christ. As you take on the job of forming your families, I am going to try my derndest to do my job of supporting, strengthening, and enabling you. Thank you for taking this work on with me, and as ever let me know how I can support you as you shepherd your families. Here's to another year!

May God bless you and keep you always, Fr. Joe
