



From the Pastor

Hello friends,

Good news! As evidenced by the fact that I'm writing these words, I'm back, and I'm alive with all my digits. It was a great trip up North and around the Eastern side of the Boundary Waters with big miles and an ambitious route. To answer a few quick FAQs: "Did we fish much?" A bit – my partner Fr. Hank got his first largemouth bass (less common than smallmouth up there), and I got a few pike – no walleye or trout. This trip was more about making miles. "How was the weather?" Really great, then really not great, then really great – Wednesday night we weathered a rowdy storm, but my frequent collaborator Fr. Brandon had given us sufficient warning via satellite messenger to batten the hatches appropriately. "Any animal sightings?" Very frequent loon sightings (more than I've ever seen), no bear, and one big bull moose swimming right past my hammock Monday night. "You camp in a hammock?" Yes, but it's a bit more technical than the old interlaced cord variety found at the beachside resort. "Do you celebrate Mass up there?" Absolutely! We usually find the most suitable, flat, waist-high boulder we can and pray the wind stays down. Sometimes it does.

Okay, there's your little update on my adventures away. Now let me share a few gratitude-oriented notes. First, thank you to everyone who picked up the slack over the last few weeks. From the Assumption Masses to everyone who helped with Fr. Michael's transportation, orientation, and nutrition, I left feeling confident in our plans, and I returned glad to see how things had kept moving! Second, thank you again to everyone who helped out with the Coon Valley picnic a few weeks ago and who is helping out with Viroqua's this weekend (after the 10:30, Eckhert Park, be there). These events generate the kind of positive energy we need, and I am very glad for your initiative and excitement! Finally, a thank you to everyone who joined John's Bible study. This study is still running, with a few Coon Valley folks and a few Viroqua folks getting together after Thursday morning's Masses to look ahead to the next weekend's readings. The fact that this crew is still gathering is awesome, but what I am most grateful for here is the collaboration being exercised and the community being shared between both my parishes. I have neither the ambition nor the desire that either St. Mary's or Annunciation should lose their identity in favor of the other, but I do have a long running hope for this exact kind of community and shared life to happen between our two unique parishes. Keep up the good work folks – we're setting ourselves up, please God, for a successful future responding to the Holy Spirit's movement.
