

From the Pastor

Hello friends.

Let's talk seasons for a minute. With Daylight Savings Time (beginning?) last weekend and the days naturally getting shorter, the morning sun now shines into the rectory chapel at just the right angle to light up my morning holy hour through several color-changing maples. It's time to admit it – summer is over (if the forecast is correct, there may even already be some light snow on the ground by the time you read this).

You may or may not know that I halfway grew up in Northern California — out there seasons consist exclusively of seventy-four degree summers and fifty degree "rainy season" winters. My memory brings back my first experience with proper seasons with dubious accuracy, when I first started coming out to Wisconsin to visit a grandparent in Elroy in 97 or 98. Winter meant bundling up to go outside, slipping around on the driveway and road (it's Elroy, the backroads aren't heavily traveled), and squeezing that daylight like a lemon. Spring meant wet and still chilly, and despite summer being beautiful and plenty long it seemed just a bit less adventurous than the cold months. I may be alone in this, but to this day I still enjoy the shifting of seasons, especially the expectant change of fall and spring.

I bring all this up because liturgically we are in a similar shifting pattern. With just a few more weeks of Ordinary Time, we are not far from a brand new liturgical year, starting with Advent on November 30. Pardon a repetitive note on how the liturgical year works – Advent starts a new Church year with its preparation for Christ's birth, then after some Christmas time we're back into Ordinary Time. After a few months we're into Lent to prepare for Christ's suffering, death, and resurrection, followed by the main event itself – the three-day Easter Triduum (Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Easter itself). Then comes a whopping 50 days of celebrating the resurrection before it's back to Ordinary Time again to let the seeds of grace planted in these extraordinary seasons grow slowly and steadily.

As for Advent, it's designed to be an intentional season of simplification, expectation, and watchful waiting – there is a certain pregnant pause built into Advent (see what I did there?). You and I both know that December typically ends up being anything but quiet, simple, watchful – it tends to fill up with school events, shopping and extra chores, and end-of-year busyness. An attitude of simplification and expectation ironically takes serious effort – I'm still workshopping how to approach Advent myself this year, but for now let me extend an invitation to you to join me in asking the question, "Lord, what do You want for me in this season?" It's a simple question, and perhaps that is exactly why it needs to be asked.
