

### From the Pastor

Hello friends,

This weekend we're holding a State of the Parish Address (think State of the Union but on a slightly smaller scale). In case you have to buzz out or your kids are having a moment and just can't stick around for another ten minutes (totally understandable), allow me to recap a few bits from it in speed mode. I see my role here as a stewarding one – for this season I have been given the gift of leading these parishes, inherited from my predecessors and eventually to be handed on to my successors. My responsibility is to listen for and try to respond to the movement of the Holy Spirit among us. Given the limits of this page I'll be a bit more direct— stick around for the sessions or feel free to call if you have any questions on the "why" behind anything.

- Looking behind RE, Liturgy Schedule, and Administration. Regarding RE, last school year we reoriented RE to focus on a family-driven catechesis. This presented a steep learning curve for families to learn how to teach the faith. The heart of formation is the Sunday liturgy, so we'll keep tying RE intimately to weekend Masses. Regarding liturgies, I promised when I started that we wouldn't touch the Mass schedule for my first year. Given our numbers on weekdays and weekends our current schedule is serving our needs well and remains the best fit. Regarding Administration, I am grateful for the way Fran and Amy (and many of you in your dedicated interests) carried us through our most recent transition. I'm working to understand everything that makes a parish tick, and that learning curve continues.
- Looking right now Capital Campaign, Liturgical Ministry, and Planning Ahead. Regarding the Campaign, we've just completed the fund drive right around 84% of our goal. This will reimburse our sidewalk replacements, the garage roof, and the church gutters. Last week we initiated replacement and repairs to the rectory fascia and gutters, which we'll hopefully see in the next calendar year. Regarding liturgies, we're building up our lector and server rosters. Regarding Planning, our RE team is mid-conversation about next year a separate communication is coming shortly with the year's schedule, programming, and sacramental plan (First Communion & Confession, Confirmation).
- Looking ahead -- Sacraments, Community, and Faith Formation. I see real growth happening here and necessary continued growth. Regarding Sacraments, our weekend Masses are well attended even during the traditionally-lower summer months. I pray for our weekday Mass attendance and utilization of confession to increase. Regarding Community, we have parishioners stepping up to organize and run community events, and I love when people mingle after Mass. I pray that you will continue seeking opportunities to encounter each other and especially to let yourselves wrestle with the discomfort of introducing yourselves to people you don't know yet. As far as faith formation is concerned, I expected last year's RE learning curve to manifest itself, and I am glad to have seen a few independent and John-driven book and scripture studies come together. I pray that our families will give this year another earnest shot in RE and that you feel the freedom and initiative to gather with each other to encounter God's word together.

There it is, a quick breakdown of where I feel our pulse. God bless you, and thank you again for trusting me with this gift of stewardship,




