## From the Pastor

Hello friends,

As promised, I'm including Noah's bio. We'll see Noah the second weekend of each month as part of his formation program, and I'll ask you to take the same initiative you took with John (for which I am very grateful) to welcome Noah into your lives and root his human & spiritual formation at the Journey program with concrete parish experience. Of course, his time with us is less intensive – whereas John lived with me every day of the month for the summer (God bless him), Noah will only be here on occasional weekends. Still, that will give us plenty of opportunity to share our lives with him. Here's what he has to say in introduction:

"Hello, my name is Noah Anason and I am a member of the journey program in La Crosse Wisconsin. I grew up in Westfield Wisconsin with my three siblings. This past spring, I graduated from Westfield High School and throughout the year I had been stressing out about applying to various colleges despite not knowing what I wanted to major in for school. As this was going on I kept returning to the thought of the priesthood. Random people I didn't know would tell me I would make a good priest. So, despite resisting it at first I eventually gave in and thought of possibly discerning the priesthood. When I heard about the journey program from my dad it was a huge weight of stress lifted off my back. This program allows me more time to discern before entering college seminary and the stresses that can come from academics. This year is very prayer-focused as we have a holy hour, we pray the liturgy of hours and celebrate mass every day. This allows me to be able to focus on what the lord is calling me to do. As I continue this spiritual journey that I am on, I ask for continued prayers for me and my fellow journeymen. I look forward to getting to know those of you in Coon Valley and Viroqua.

And back to me. I'm writing this article between sessions on Wednesday of that Pastoral Development Workshop up in the Cities. Some twenty pastors ranging from brand new to old & crusty (that'll be me in no time) got here Sunday evening, and we hit the ground running. Short version: I've been impressed. Long version: everything started off with personal and pastoral development (character, time management, leadership skills), moving into practical tools (communications, HR, conflict, gift & charism recognition), coming into today's focus on strategic planning and vision & mission development. As we move into tomorrow and Friday we'll dive into integration and practical planning. They brought out the big guns – a mix of heavy hitting corporate types, lay church professionals, and longtime pastors - and at next week's clergy conference I'll be talking with Fr. Woody (our Vicar for Clergy/my boss) and Fr. Sakowski (the director of ongoing care for priests) to share both the material and also a strong recommendation for my brothers to attend as they step into their new pastorates over the next few years. I imagine this will have an impact on our St. Mary'ses over the coming years and on my own pastoring, and as ever I thank you for taking my absence graciously. God bless you all, and let's keep listening to the Lord together!


