



From the Pastor

Hello friends.

Early last week our deacons and priests got together for our annual Fall Clergy Conference. This conference and the summer's Priest Unity Days make up the two official clergy gatherings every year, with Priest Unity Days traditionally leaning into fraternity and prayer and FCC into business. I mentioned last weekend that I was having my fraternity (Frs. McCarty, Gunther, Hokamp, Williams, and Schmitt) over for the evening, which unofficially started off the whole few days (with a really quite wellmade moose stew). While these monthly meetings don't typically coincide with Diocesan business, it worked quite well to kick off our broader Diocesan fraternity with this focused group time.

Once the conference officially started on Monday we looked at personal renewal as a general theme – Fr. Mark Pierce (Pastor of my first assignment and a brilliant student and presenter of Sacred Scripture) invited us to let ourselves be lifelong students (that is, to not stop studying and expanding once we leave seminary), Dr. Jennifer and Mr. Nick Althoff invited us to take our physical health with a modicum of seriousness, and Diocesan liturgist Chris Carstens invited us to examine our Ars Celebrandi – that is, the Art of Celebrating the Liturgy. This afternoon blended our own wellbeing (parts, I suppose, of what may fit into the overused term "self-care") with intentional and continuing formation. Perhaps it could all be summed up under the broader "sharpening the saw."

On Tuesday Bishop Battersby kicked us off with his message – an exhortation to let our priesthoods be more Jesus' priesthood than our own. We were all predictably twitchy to hear if he had anything to say about restructuring, merging, etc. As has become its own norm, Bishop didn't give us a quick fix but instead invited us to curiosity and docility. Through this whole process the shared temptation to be handed "the Plan" has been a constant - there are big important numbers and big important needs and big important personnel and congregation trends out there, and you and I (and the gathered body of priests) wait in watchful expectation. Tension is hard, and it's built into us to want to "arrive" at a safe and final destination. The kicker with that is that for 2000 years the Church has never been about "arriving" here on Earth – it's been about journeying in the footsteps of the Good Shepherd to our final arrival in the next life. Through Fr. Sakowski's listening sessions, our own cooperation between parishes, and the big picture work the Holy Spirit is leading us through, Bishop's repeated narrative is a movement "from maintenance to mission" honoring and stewarding what we've inherited, but above all following the example of the early disciples to ask in each moment, "where are You leading us right now, Lord?"

All Saints' Day - November 1




