#### Hello friends,

A few weeks ago I solicited tree sponsors at the end of Mass to craft and beautify our grounds, and you all came through. Before we get into that, let me throw out another BIG thank you to everyone who's been chipping in for our recent works. From necessary repairs like gutters and sidewalks to work with a cosmetic twist like next year's rectory fascia replacement and painting, I've been very encouraged to see such positive response to our Pastoral and Finance Councils' initiatives. Thank you for investing in our space so well!

This tree planting fits that theme – taking the excellent space we have and structuring it to support our parish's communal and liturgical needs. We've also got a good connection with a landscape architect up in Viroqua, who's been helping me out with our substantial grounds work there. Franz is working with a few of our folks to map things out with an eve toward framing the space – tying our whole campus together while serving our existing needs (I'm looking at you, Summerfest tent). You can see on the sketched map below where we're bringing in some new trees (marked "NW"): three large deciduous (maple, oak) in the South lot arcing along Lafollette and the property line to enclose and differentiate the space, two more honey locusts along Hwy 14 to flank the existing one and to create a break between the road and our property, and four small fruiting trees along the church's East sidewalk to craft a walkway there. Between mowing and rain it may be hard to see the paint now (and for all I know, writing Thursday, we may have a foot of snow on the ground by the time you read this), but if you're really jonesing to see what we're looking at you can see the front lot trees marked in the grass. I'll invite you to take a few minutes to walk the land and imagine how this framing will make the space feel, and of course let me know if you have any questions. God willing, we'll get the trees in before the ground freezes up so they can get an earnest start next spring. Hwy 14
