From the Pastor

Hello friends, and happy Advent!

First, a point of business. There is snow outside. I may not like it, you may not like it, but the simple fact is it's our fault we haven't moved to New Mexico by now. As



it does with everything, snow naturally affects our schedules around here. I will try my derndest to make sure weekend Masses happen as scheduled, even if it means taking a snowmobile down the hill, so generally count on those staying in place. As far as weekday Masses go, in Coon Valley we tend to follow the school systems (check Viroqua and Coon Valley) – if there's a snow day or snow delay it means no Mass that day. As for Viroqua, snow days usually don't change the weekday Mass schedule, since I live a short little walk away.



Second, a Mass note. On Monday December 8 we're celebrating the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception. This is a holy day of obligation, meaning it's a day when we're required to go to Mass at some point. There's a strangeness with this feast falling on a Monday – while you can have a vigil Mass (like the

Saturday evening Mass is a vigil for Sunday), you can't double up with a Sunday evening Mass for both Sunday and the Solemnity. Short version – plan on attending one of our extra Masses for Immaculate Conception in addition to your customary Sunday Mass – 7:00 on Sunday the seventh in Viroqua, 12:10 on Monday in Viroqua, and 5:15 on Monday in Coon Valley.

And a final note that's on my mind with Thanksgiving last week (or tomorrow, depending on whether you're writing or reading this article), the word "thanksgiving" itself. I am perpetually at war with the busyness of late November into December – my ambition will forever look forward to (and seldom fully arrive at) quieting down through Advent in preparation for Christmas. I think there's something powerful about the intentional and reserved stepping into these last few weeks of Mary's pregnancy it's a time of waiting and watchfulness, of taking stock and preparing for the Messiah to come into the world. Maybe there's an analog to my own Advent busyness in Mary and Joseph's own experience – as much as they may have desired and sculpted a "quiet" late pregnancy, that hundred mile journey to Bethlehem still had to happen. Anyhow, quiet or not it's maybe appropriate that we lean into this season with Thanksgiving as a start. The word "eucharist" itself comes from the Greek "Eucharistein" thanksgiving. Of the many words that we use for this important sacrament – "Holy Communion," "Eucharist," "Blessed Sacrament" – "Eucharist" effectively gets at the reality that whatever we have to give we have first been given ourselves. May God bless you as we lean into this season and prepare your heart to receive Him in a few Fr. Joe weeks!

Advent

"Getting Ready"

Advent is the time that we set aside for preparing our hearts before the annual celebrations of Christ's birth on Christmas. The Incarnation – God becoming man - is the turning point of history. Our Heavenly Father loves us so deeply that He promised to send us a Savior after the Original Sin of Adam and Eve. And He kept His promise! The Son of God was born in Bethlehem in order to give His life for us on the cross so that our sins can be forgiven, so that we "may have life, and have it to the full." (John 10:10) Living life to the full means having a relationship with Jesus in prayer, growing in the light of truth that Christ revealed to us, and being united with Him in Sacraments. This is no small matter, and of course, we want to take this time during Advent to prepare - "get ready" - to receive Christ anew this Christmas.

The priest's vestments during Advent are purple, the color of penance and sacrifice. They are a constant reminder of our need to get ready – to be cleansed and purified. How does one go about preparing? Advent is a season for stepping back from our busy

lives, taking time in stillness and solitude, to reflect more deeply on the mystery of God's Incarnation – Jesus taking on human flesh to be among us. This can also include something like not having dessert occasionally, or turning off the TV for one night or setting aside an electronic device for an hour. Or this can include helping someone in need or visiting a person who is lonely. We offer small sacrifices so that during this season of grace we might have an open, welcoming heart with room to receive Jesus.

We will be surprised how these long-held Catholic traditions of preparing allow us to see and understand truths that may be hidden from our "human eyes." In the silence of prayer, the Lord will give us new insights, that we may see with "spiritual eyes" and understand better the wonder of the mystery of Jesus who is our Savior. As we remember His coming as the Christ Child in Bethlehem, and know He is with us in each present moment - He who is "Emmanuel, God with us" - we also look forward to His Second Coming in glory. Intentionally remembering preparing, pondering, praying with our hearts - is essential

because unfortunately without this we are bound to forget. Be encouraged to ask for the grace of this "remembering" and you will have a truly blessed Christmas this year!
