

From the Pastor

Hello friends,

If you happened to attend the 10:30 Mass last weekend, you witnessed an anomaly to our normal weekend liturgy – a convalidation, which is the Catholic word for the sacramental marriage of an existing civil union. You all know my nondominating preference for celebrating moments like this at one of our scheduled weekend Masses. For one thing, it provides an excellent example for folks that might not know what they're missing – a hopeful spark. For another, it draws out the communal nature of sacraments that is, the way they draw us more deeply into something bigger than ourselves. Baptism isn't just for the child being baptized or the family that's coming together for it, just like a child receiving First Communion or a high schooler being Confirmed isn't about that person in that moment. It's about the Body of Christ (that is, the Church) being built up by a new member and welcoming and supporting this disciple in their relationship with the Lord and His Church. Even Confession, the most confidential sacrament and human experience there is, isn't limited to the penitent's personal sins being forgiven (there's no such thing as a sin that just affects me or "doesn't hurt anyone") - it's about restoring them to harmony and "right relationship" (a deceptively inconspicuous, remarkably significant concept in Scripture) with God, the people, and within themselves.

If you were at that Mass and convalidation last weekend, you also heard me speaking at length about "vocation." When we talk about "vocation" we're talking about "calling" – that is, what God is calling each Christian soul to. Generally we refer to four distinct vocations: marriage, holy orders (deacon, priest, bishop), religious life (monk, nun, sister, etc.), and consecrated single life. It's worth pushing even a little further into vocation, because it's bigger than these four. The Vatican II document Lumen Gentium (excellent reading on the Church as the light of the world, if you can slow yourself down to it) refers to the "Universal Call to Holiness" – that distinct movement of the Holy Spirit in each person's heart to draw us out of ourselves to live for "the other." This is all to say that each Christian soul – each and every one of us – is called before anything else to sainthood – to starting while we're in this world the life we'll hopefully live in the next one. You don't have to be a Saint yet (that is, a big leaguer like St. Peter or St. Mother Teresa), but the door is open for each one of us to do the daily work of letting the Holy Spirit move in our lives.

One last plug for Advent next weekend – it's an excellent season to identify where the Lord is calling me and you to unique holiness in our particular lives, where we're responding well, and where we have room to grow. So be a saint.
