





From the Pastor

Friends,

This week I want to share a simple prayer that my spiritual director recently shared with me – the "Unity Prayer" from Elizabeth Kindelmann's Flame of Love. Notice the wording in here – a series of personal elements (feet, hands, hearts, souls, thoughts, ears, glances, and lips) and dispositions (those of togetherness, unity, unison, harmony, and hope for mercy) – yet all are rooted in the primary naming "My adorable Jesus," and request for Him to lead. Importantly, this is the difference between an encouraging or sentimental aphorism (also good, but different) and a prayer – the former is directed to self, the latter is directed to the Lord. This is an important reminder that the work of Christian living is before anything I do Christ's own work in me and you. Anyway, it is a beautiful prayer and I'll let it speak for itself.



The Unity Prayer

My adorable Jesus,
May our feet journey together;
May our hands gather in unity;
May our hearts beat in unison;
May our souls be in harmony;
May our thoughts be as one;

May our ears listen to the silence together; May our glances profoundly penetrate each other; May our lips pray together to gain mercy from the eternal Father, amen.

In our nation and parishes we need the Holy Spirit's healing and restoration and unity. By my director's instruction I am preparing for a novena of novenas (that is, praying this prayer three times in morning, afternoon, and evening, nine days in a row) starting this Monday (September 15, the feast of Our Lady of Sorrows) and ending next Tuesday (September 23, the feast of St. Pio, a powerful advocate for spiritual liberation and restoration). I invite you to join me.
