

From the Pastor

Hello friends,

I have a few notes of gratitude to share this weekend.

First, as you hopefully noticed this weekend, I am alive. That is good news. Last weekend Fr. Reither made a surprise appearance when food poisoning or the flu or something equally nefarious took me down. The team at St. Pat's came through in a pinch, with Monsignor Kachel taking over their weekend Masses and Fr. Tim coming down: A) to celebrate Masses for us and B) to give up his homily-less weekend. There's something extra to be grateful for there – I rather enjoy the process of developing and delivering an effective homily, but there's a relief to Deacon stepping up to preach to give me the chance to take a breath and hear the fruit of another preacher's work. Big thanks to Fr. Tim on both counts!

Second, this week I'll be on retreat in Oconomowoc. Priests are required to make at least a five-day retreat every year – it's a wise and effective reminder of the need to pause. This week my spiritual director will be leading us



through some healing and deliverance work, and forty or fifty priests will be praying together and making the space to listen for the voice of the Holy Spirit. A pertinent note: in battle a retreat is a strategic withdrawal to recuperate and reinforce before re-engaging. A spiritual retreat is similar – rest is important, but just as important is realizing that pastoral work is wearing and costs something. My favorite tool down in the woodshop is my set of chisels. They're precise, they're capable of remarkable clean work (and also of ruining an entire project with one misplaced strike along the grain), but every blow curls that cutting edge back just a little bit more. An effective chisel needs just as much time in methodical pause as it does in practical application. Thank you for understanding the need for me to step back from daily Masses and administrative and pastoral work to keep myself grounded in the Lord!

Finally, a big thank you to all of you who are engaging either of our Bible Studies (the Thursday morning crew and the folks diving into the Panorama of the Old Testament study). Many of you put in the serious work of engaging the scriptures for the coming weekend and opening up the Lord's Word in personal and group study – it makes the homilist's job much more fruitful when there's already some familiarity among the congregation with the Message the Holy Spirit has prepared for us. A good homily is a team effort – it certainly demands serious engagement and prayer on the preacher's part, but just as much it demands the full and active participation of the congregation receiving the homilist's words. Thank you for the work you are doing.

DID YOU KNOW?

If you are 70 ½ or older, you can do a **qualified charitable distribution (QCD)** of up to \$100,000 a year from your **IRA directly to a charity**. The distribution won't show up in your adjusted gross income and CAN count toward your required minimum distribution (RMD). The QCD allows you to be more strategic with your RMD. Consult your tax advisor before making any decisions. If a QCD is for you, please consider St. Mary's Parish as your charity of choice.
