

From the Pastor

Hello friends,

I've just returned from a retreat up in the Wausau area – in a group context we employed story work to continue our own processes of integration. Ever since I first encountered it during seminary formation, this type of work has been important for me in my own growth as a disciple and (more recently) a priest, and it may inform some of the themes of healing, redemptive suffering, and the value of Christ's cross you see running throughout my homilies. Most recently we (that is, our parishes) spent Advent focusing on those dark corners of our own hearts where we need to invite Christ's light to shine, and this Christmas season we've been extending that discerned invitation to the Holy Spirit. This is the ongoing and lifelong work of discipleship. Thank you for bearing with me as I stepped away for the week – I know there's a real cost to my absence from our parishes, and I am grateful for your willingness to let me sharpen the proverbial saw!

Over the next few months, you may notice a few other retreats going on around our parishes. Next weekend Viroqua will host a Married Love retreat – a day-long event that happens throughout the diocese to prepare engaged couples for their upcoming marriages. Deacon Tully and several of our own couples are going to help Deacon Tony and I with this event, and I am looking forward to working through several themes with the couples: covenant theology of marriage, openness to life, permanence, and faithfulness. Next month I'll be leading a few independent retreats - the first will be for some young families from the Twin Cities. One of my missionary friends reached out to me to see if the husbands and fathers in the group could arrange a retreat as a Christmas gift to their wives, which is an awesome idea. The husbands are going to take on the task of cooking and caring for the kids in town here, while their wives spend some time in prayer and ongoing formation – again, following that beautiful theme of sharpening the saw. The second will be for a very special group of my friends who have banded together for something called the Seven Sisters Apostolate - a group of women who each take one day a week to pray a holy hour for this particular priest and his ministry. You didn't know it, but these friends (predominantly from my most recent Holy Land pilgrimage) have been praying earnestly for all of you and for my own priesthood, and this retreat will be a specially important chance for our parishes to pray for and offer a moment of rest to a team who are lovingly praying for us every day. It's also a good reminder that any good work that happens in our parishes is the fruit of the Holy Spirit, aided by earnest intercession from our own people and beyond. Keep up your own work in that regard!

God bless you, and Merry Christmas still!

The Epiphany Blessing of the Home


The Blessing of homes (schools, places of employment, etc) on Epiphany revives the beautiful custom of making our homes sacramentals. Sacramentals make us more mindful, receptive, and cooperative with God's grace. This blessing also reminds us that Christ is the One Who enlightens our hearts and homes with His love. Marking doorways with blessed chalk is also a witness of faith. Use the chalk to mark above the main door and, if possible, over all exterior doors with the inscription for this year:

$$20 + C + M + B + 24$$

DID YOU KNOW?

If you are 70 ½ or older, you can do a qualified charitable distribution (QCD) of up to \$100,000 a year from your IRA directly to a charity. The distribution won't show up in your adjusted gross income and CAN count toward your required minimum distribution (RMD). The QCD allows you to be more strategic with your RMD. Consult your tax advisor before making any decisions. If a QCD is for you, please consider St. Mary's Parish as your charity of choice.

Eucharistic Revival

THE EUCHARISTIC PILGRIMAGE day will begin with a Eucharistic Procession.
