#### From the Pastor

Hello friends,

This weekend we're bringing back the Diocesan Annual Appeal. This is one of those drives that's been made a bit unnormal (some would say abnormal, but I prefer inventing words) through COVID and with the Capital Campaign (into which the Annual Appeal for 22-23 was built), so a



part of this weekend involves normalizing it again. To clarify, there are two main ways that we support the work being done at the Diocese for our parishes: first, a quarterly quota based on our attendance, census, and giving, and second this appeal. While the quota supports the standard operating expenses of the diocese, this appeal supports many of the mission-driven efforts that would otherwise be funded by second collections throughout the year. "But Fr. Joe," you may be asking yourself, "didn't we just have an extra collection for the Missions?" Excellent question. Yes, we did, for World Mission Sunday. That's one of the collections the broad Church has us take up every year to support the Society for the Propagation of the Faith – that branch of the Church that operates what we usually think of when we hear "missionary work" (that is, missionaries serving those in tangible need, catechesis and the building of new churches, health care, and education). Beyond that, we try to keep extra asks down.

So how is the Annual Appeal different? This drive specifically supports the mission-driven initiatives within our diocese, such as our own mission outreach in Peru, the vocations office and our seminarians, ongoing support and formation of clergy, televised Masses, Catholic education, etc. Our target at St. Mary's this year is \$14,515, and whatever we raise over that target comes directly back to our parish. By way of breakdown, last year's appeal was disbursed with 22% of proceeds going to vocations and support for priests, deacons, and consecrated & religious life, 19% to Missions and Works of Charity, 29% to parish ministry support, 19% to parish services, and 9% to Catholic schools. Over the next few weeks, you'll receive mailings from the Diocese requesting you to contribute to this appeal - I would ask you to seriously consider supporting our broader Church through this work.


