

FOCUS: Christ helps us grow in faith and in the ability to act in his name.

Courage, a gift of the Holy Spirit, lies at the heart of today's Scripture - the courage to be faithful to Christ and the Gospel in all things and in all places. Like the disciples, we should be unafraid to ask Jesus for an increase in faith, for he reminds us that even with the smallest amount of faith we have the ability to do great things in his name.

LITURGY OF THE WORD

In the first reading, Habakkuk cries out to the Lord, and the Lord answers. Saint Paul encourages Timothy to never lack courage or be ashamed of his faith in Jesus Christ. In the Gospel, the Apostles ask Jesus to increase [their] faith, and Jesus gives them instruction using a mustard seed as a metaphor.

DID YOU KNOW?

From the Parochial Administrator

Hello friends,

Thanks to the hard work of several of our people and your own patience to ride the waves while we've figured out what it needs to look like this year, we're finally launching religious education this weekend – that's big news!

A quick breakdown of what's coming up (or, if you're reading this after the weekend's Masses, what's just happened): this weekend after the 8:30 Mass Bridget Goodwin and I will be presenting October's curriculum to parents and kids together. I'll step up first to share a little bit about the year's theme (a life of Christian prayer) and to start us off with the first few lessons ("What is prayer" and "Prayer in Salvation History"), then Bridget will share a bit about how she, as both catechist and mother, is planning on implementing the month's material within her family. Each of the two lessons each month will have activities to help you communicate the material to your kids, but remember that not every activity is meant for every kid - for younger kids some of the more interactive and creative material will be appropriate, whereas some of the discussion and interpretive material may be more effective with some of the older kids, even into Middle or High School.

This program has recently and effectively been reinterpreted to me as "so it's basically homeschooled religious education?" It's a great question. And the stripped-down answer is yes. With our two main goals of (1) putting the Mass at the heart of anything we do (especially religious formation) and (2) recentering religious formation where it's most effectively done – in the family – our organizational goal is to give you the tools you need to help your family grow as disciples together. For all the parents reading this, that starts first with your own formation, discipleship, and relationship with the Lord, and only once that process is happening does it pour out of that personal work into your kids' formation, discipleship, and relationship with the Lord.

As far as other business goes, first, please join us for the **pancake breakfast next weekend**. I'm handing the 10:30 Mass off to Fr. McCarty, provided he survives the next week with me, so I hope to see you there!

Second, here's another reminder that this week I will be out of town Sunday afternoon through Friday evening. I'll be taking three other priests up into the Boundary Waters (for anyone particularly interested, around Kawishiwi, Polly and Sawbill Lakes) for a few nights in the wilderness. This is not my first proverbial rodeo, so I make it a high probability that most of us make it back out alive. I certainly will. The practical effect of this around the parish is that there will not be daily Mass at either Viroqua or Coon Valley this week. If you would like to join them, Deacon Tony will be leading a Communion Service Wednesday evening in Viroqua (6:30), followed by an hour of adoration. If you need a priest throughout the course of this week, please contact Fr. Daniel Sedlacek in Genoa at 608-689-2646.

Finally, Fr. Michael Klos shared with me that someone you may know well, **Jean (Gilkes) Lange passed away this past week**. Fr. Klos will be handling funeral arrangements out at Sacred Heart in Cashton, with a visitation Monday from 4:00 to 7:00 PM and the funeral on Tuesday at 10:30. Eternal rest grant unto her, O Lord!


