From the Pastor

Hello friends,

Last weekend I shared a process to forgive when forgiving is hard. As my friend C.S. Lewis says, "Everyone thinks forgiveness is a lovely idea until he has something to forgive." In case you want or need to go deeper in forgiveness (the ten minutes I gave it just scratches the surface), allow me to put this process in writing. I'd recommend you arrange the environment for this exercise and remember it's a process that sometimes needs 77 repetitions – get a good cup of coffee and sit out on the deck, come to the church, do whatever you have to do to set time aside the time and space to go deep.

First, let's remind ourselves why we're talking about this: when Peter asks Jesus, "when my brother sins against me, how many times must I forgive? As many as seven times?" Jesus responds to him, "I tell you, not seven times, but seventy-seven times." With that in mind, the process:

- 1. Acknowledge the thing needing forgiving. Rather than dismissing or exaggerating a real hurt, take a real accounting of the damage that's been done and the real cost of forgiveness. This is not meant to besmirch the person or institution you need to forgive, but rather to shine a light on something that might seem more comfortably hidden in the dark.
- 2. Let go of and reject resentment. This is an effort of your will. It doesn't mean you are forgetting the reality of what's happened or even that you are yet to the point of reconciling and healing the relationship, but that you're choosing not to feed and nurse the anger or bitterness. As 25 different original authors once said, "resentment is like drinking poison and waiting for it to kill the other person." Don't drink the poison.
- 3. Make an act of forgiveness in Jesus' name: "In Jesus' name, I forgive ______ for _____." Whereas step 2 is very will-driven, step 3 makes this a very spiritual process, trusting the work to Someone who can do the work you can't do yourself. Just like the resentment step, this is one of those where the distance between head and heart can be quite significant. The 77 times comes in in a big way here you might not feel it the first or second or third time, but that doesn't mean there isn't real work happening. Besides that, if you don't forgive the third time, you'll never get to the fourth time or the seventy-seventh time.

I'll share one final resource for your continued reflection: Fr. Mike Schmitz' homily from last weekend. Look it up on Youtube with the search "Fr. Mike Schmitz As we forgive" or find his homilies on your podcast platform of choice under "Sunday homilies with Fr. Mike Schmitz." I listened to his homily on the way to golf with some priests last Monday, and all I could think was "well dang. That's a good homily."

Sauerkraut Supper - Oct 11




