From the Pastor and Seminarian

Hello friends,

Seasons don't always go quite the way we expect. It might just be me, but it always seems that when Advent comes around (a season that's purpose built to quiet down and prepare our hearts and minds for Baby Jesus' worldchanging birthday) my life gets suddenly crazy busy. Correction: it's not just me. Literally everybody I ever talk to in December says quieting down during Advent is more a dream than a reality. It's the same thing with summers in the parish. If a parish has a school (not us), the end of the academic year brings a big sigh of relief, but even on our end the culmination of Religious Education for the year carried a bit of a punctuation mark. Usually, ministries and activities slowdown in summer time, and it's a good chance for someone like me or for many of you who take an active role in making our culture and life happen to take a deep breath. But I've got to tell you – I've put John through the ringer ever since he got here. Part of June's busyness came from catching up after my own time away in the Holy Land and part came from wrapping up First Communions and the campaign's fund drive, but I am glad now that things are starting to quiet down a bit so we can take stock and prepare for Year Two of my time here (Wednesday?) with more settled Ordinary-Time-ish heart rates. In the middle of that calming down, let me share a few business-oriented updates with you.

The Capital Campaign: Thank you to everyone who has been pledging in the campaign. As of this writing, we have reached \$67,120 in pledges toward our \$105,000 goal, and that number is ticking up toward the target. A few late-pledging folks have asked whether my announcement last weekend about the campaign's wrap-up meant June 30 was a hard enddate. It's a good chance for clarification – pledges will be accepted whenever they come in, even after June 30, but our active solicitation for support has ended.

Religious Education: We'll be planning Religious Education for next year throughout July. The brief version is that, after discussion with the Pastoral Council, we'll be continuing with another year of family-based RE. Confirmation classes for both parishes will be hosted in Viroqua, and we'll get more details out to you as they come together.

Parish Summer Picnic: Several of our parishioners have come together to put on a parish picnic on July 29! Specific details are still coming together, but if you promise not to tell anybody that I'm the one who told you, I'll hint that I've heard rumblings about a bouncy house, a dunk tank for John, a shaved ice station, and a band. It's going to be awesome. Put it in your calendars.


