

From the Pastor

Hello friends.

In just two weeks here we're flipping over into a new liturgical year with the start of Advent (the evening of November 29). Pardon a possibly repetitive note on how the liturgical year works – Advent starts a new Church year with its preparation for Christ's birth, then after some Christmas time (more than just December 25) we're back into Ordinary Time. After a few months of OT, we're into Lent to prepare for Christ's suffering, death, and resurrection, then comes the main event with the three-day Easter Triduum (Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Easter itself), followed by a whopping 50 days of celebrating the resurrection. Then it's back to Ordinary Time again to let the seeds of grace planted in extraordinary seasons grow slowly and steadily.

So again, Advent is coming. While Advent and Lent share a penitential and reflective flavor, what's especially important about Advent is the relationship between darkness and light that runs through it. For one thing, the season lands squarely over the darkest time of year outside, with the Winter Solstice on December 21. The readings and prayers in Mass have a certain foreboding and deep-breathing, as if they're winding up for something (someone) New to break in. All of this leads up to Christmas Eve and Day, when God's light finally breaks into the world through the birth of Jesus Christ.

It's a good idea to plan ahead for seasons like Advent or Lent – to spend some time in the leadup asking the Lord "how are you trying to move in my life? How are you trying to prepare my heart to receive Your light?" I find it important in my own life during Advent and Christmas to structure in space to be still with the Lord – real rest certainly takes real work. Following up on last year's daily adoration, we're adding in a few extra timeslots for adoration, including one for families on December 13 and 20. I have these times scattered across the day



with the hopes that one of them will work out in your schedule – don't feel like you need to be at every spot, but please receive my invitation to join us for one of these moments:

Advent Adoration Options:

- *Monday:* 7:00-7:30 AM in Viroqua
- *Tuesday:* 4:30-5:00 PM in Coon Valley (continuing after Advent)
- Wednesday: 5:45-6:30 PM in Viroqua (continuing after Advent)
- *Thursday:* 7:30-8:00 AM in Coon Valley
- Friday: 8:30-9:30 AM in Viroqua
- *Saturday:* 9:00-10:00 AM, changing locations in Viroqua on December 6 and 20, in Coon Valley on December 13


